# Incident Follow Up

**Hazardous Substances** 



We've had 2 recent events involving hydraulic fluid, 1 involving injection under pressure, the other a simple cut.

"Worker cuts thumb while changing chain on harvester. He then fixes a hydraulic leak without covering the cut first. The next day the worker has an infected cut requiring medical treatment". This was a near fatal blood poisoning. The infection did not happen 'under pressure', the critical point was the cut on the first knuckle of the thumb (we suspect the cut may have knicked a capillary).



Skin irritation should not occur when used as recommended.

Note: High Pressure Applications Injections through the skin resulting from contact with the product at high pressure constitute a major medical emergency. Injuries may not appear serious at first but within a few hours tissue becomes swollen, & discoloured

#### Learnings:

- This could happen to any of us who work with engines and oils at work or at home.
- It's important to know that any substance can be harmful once it gets past the skin barrier.
- Always cover breaks in the skin when using chemicals.
- Where high pressure injection is possible, deenergise and always use protective gloves.

### **Operating Damages - Tutira**

The gate damage is suspected to be from a log truck making contact. It's a relatively narrow gateway for larger vehicles and the driver may have had no idea.


If you suspect you may have made contact with something or see new damage, please contact your Pan Pac co-ordinator.

In the news this month, Kiwi Rail, Napier Port and Earnslaw One combined forces to reinstate the log train from Waiouru, via Palmerston North to the Napier Port. Estimated to be 19 wagging, 600 tonnes, five days.



Removing 21 log trucks from the Napier-Taihape Road which we know continues to be in a poor state of repair.

## 2025 Start Up

Monday 6<sup>th</sup> January was planned to be a slow start with all operations completing set up, pre-start inspections (Forest lots & machinery) across Forests operations.

Rain over the Christmas break (and a few other events) significantly impacted the pre-break planning. And we weren't the only ones as our cartage out-work was slim as well.

This impacted a large portion of our team and yours; Harvest crews expecting to pace their start, instead pushed to 6 days to get the wood flowing.

Log Cartage volume was and continues to be significantly down as the outwork slowly builds.

It was great to see a push to get our stems fleet & 3PY running at capacity early. These teams needed a 'break' they were the last up and running after the Cyclone.

# Environment

#### A successful falcon nest in Tutira

You may remember the trail camera on the falcon nest in Tutira woodlot in December. The camera captured this image of an adult bird feeding it's chick. Some days after this, the birds all left the original nesting site as the chick become more mobile. From this time, operations can start encroaching on the buffer zone. Using trail cameras is a game changer for us to be able to monitor nest progress and success and plan harvest activities around them.



#### Wetlands... again!

Sunday the 2nd February was world wetland day, which is timely as there's been a lot happening in this space lately!

Currently we've got one consent application in waiting for some temporary crossings in a woodlot in Waiwhare, planning some willow control in a wetland in Kaweka, have had 2 harvest plans rejigged to pull away from wetlands in Mohaka and Manhakuri and have had an ecologist out to help deliniate a wetland in a woodlot in Central Hawke's Bay.

This one in particular was spotted by the keen eye'd Kayne Warner of MWL (further info under Great Work, frong page).

It's crucial to stay vigilant in identifying potential wetlands within our work areas. Under the NES-CF and the RMA, operations around and within wetlands over 0.25 hectares (roughly a quarter of a rugby field) will likely require a resource consent or an alternative work plan.

Not all wetlands are immediately obvious. They can range from large swampy areas and shallow lakes to seasonally wet ground that appears dry for part of the year. The key factor is vegetation—if an area predominantly contains wetland plant species, it is classified as a wetland under the RMA and NES-CF regulations, regardless of how wet it looks at any given time.

Proper identification and early planning can help avoid compliance issues and protect these sensitive environments. While Pan Pac staff do our best to identify and plan around these sensitive ecosystems, there may be some we have missed. So it's equally essential that contractors familiarise themselves with identifying them, and if in doubt get Dan out for a look!



Wetland in a woodlot in CHB. If an area makes up >50% wetland species like these rushes, it's considered a wetland even if the ground is dry. We can't operate machinery within 5m of a wetland like this without resource consent.
